

Message from RLPOA President, Bob Strachota

The purpose of this email is to notify the Round Lake Property Owners Association (RLPOA) that my family cabin has been targeted with acts of vandalism and disruption.

The majority of the RLPOA Board and myself as President believe that the Temporary Restraining Order (TRO) concerning NN culverts was an appropriate action to insure that an active and comprehensive water management system be adopted for managing extreme circumstances of low and high water. This position is not shared by all.

For over 25 years, our cabin has been safe and not subject to vandalism, violence or outside disruption. Recently, this has changed and we do not feel secure and able to peacefully enjoy our cabin. This is a price that I did not expect to pay in attempting to look after the welfare of our lake and watershed. I have no personal interest in high or low water and I am only willing to see this through with your support. Violence and vandalism are not fair negotiating methods to use in America. If you hear of anyone or anything that relates to these tactics, please confidentially call the Sheriff's office at 715-634-5213 or 715-634-4858. There is an investigation going on to hold the appropriate people accountable.

Please attend the October 16, 2010 RLPOA Fall meeting (9AM Round Lake Town Hall) to let your Board know if you support an active water management system for both high and low water in the Round Lake watershed district.
