- III. Inventory of existing conditions
 - a. Data to understand each identified issue
- IV. Management alternatives by issue
 - a. Issue x
 - i. Description of issue
 - ii. Management alternatives
 - iii. Management option chosen
 - b. Repeat for each issue
- V. Preferred/ recommended plan as a whole
- VI. Action plan
 - a. Who, what, where and when
- VII. Monitoring and Evaluation

A “regional analysis” shall be a broad analysis of local and regional factors based upon information that is reasonably available and is supported by credible scientific evidence, and shall, wherever applicable, include an analysis of the following:

1. Land ownership and land use patterns;
2. Cultural resources;
3. Biological diversity, including natural communities and their distribution;
4. Ecological capability data;
5. Recreation resources and their use, capability and demand;
6. Socio-economic conditions and benefits, including local economies; and
7. Other issues germane to managing natural resources and public use.
